Presentation: Elements that make up an Essential Education Experience (E3) with Cassandra	
Reed-Vandam	
Discussed the immersive experiences, service learning, and student-driven experiences that	
make up a part of the E3 framework. She discussed what counts as an E3 course. The courses	
must include experiential learning, regular critical reflection, interdisciplinary approaches, best	
practices and ethics, and engagement with the ePortfolio platform, PebblePad. The platform	
will be rolled out in the 2026/27 academic year. Major-restricted capstone and enterprise courses, summer cooperative learning programs, and student volunteering within an	
organization (no course structure), and courses lacking hands-on engagement, are not part of	
this program. The E3 program is gradually rolling out with full engagement by AY27/28 with	
1500 seats. AY 25/26 has a capacity for 500 seats at present. The leadership has engaged with	
community organization partners exploring how best to frame the engagement with these	
external organizations.
